

Here is the topic for your child's lesson today. Continue what was taught in class at home in your conversation and prayers...

The account of Jacob's favorite serves as today's son. Joseph. lesson, "Hope in Hardship." This account occupies a turning point in the history of God's people. The unusual timeline of Joseph's life includes him being despised by his brothers, being sold into slavery, attaining success and then losing it false accusations, all to being imprisoned, and serving in the court of Pharaoh.
