FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Fellow Saints,

A pastor on our Central Illinois District staff shared a wonderful devotion with us in a virtual meeting we had this week. It was based upon Jesus' feeding of the 5,000 (John 6), and keyed on this powerful part of the story: Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread, so that these people can eat?" He said this to test him, for [Jesus] Himself knew what He would do." (vv 5-6)

Jesus knew what He would do, and through a series of events, He did it.

You and I don't know what we're going to do tomorrow, let alone when the restrictions related to public health are lifted. Not knowing sparks anxiety in us. I can only imagine how the 12 disciples felt as they looked out over a huge crowd with limited resources. Jesus, though, was not anxious. Nor is He today. He knows what He is going to do with St. John's Lutheran Church, with the congregations of our District and Synod, with and for our neighbors, and with your precious life and family.

He's going to continue to deliver His Word to us, and through us. He's going to provide for people's needs by the care of neighbors. He's going to use suffering to produce endurance, character and hope. He's going to overcome death and sin. Good Friday and Easter have already secured the victory.

I don't know if we will have public Services in Holy Week. I consult with our Elders throughout each week and we make decisions based **auidance** statewide and Christian wisdom through prayer. I know I'm planning for the Rite of Confirmation on May 3, and that it will be ok if we have to move it. Jesus knows what He is going to do.

I know you're praying for others. I hope you're also reaching out to members and neighbors in safe and warm ways. People need to hear from you. You need to be connected to them. And best of all, we all need to rest in this truth: Jesus knows what He is going to do.
