# **From Our Pastor**

Oh, it's wonderful to have many of you back inside the Church! For those who are waiting, we understand, and we can wait.

Today we begin hearing Epistle Readings from the letter to the Romans. Not the whole letter, but lots of meat -- Law and Gospel -- from Romans 6-14. My classmate, Professor Dave Schmitt, shared his insightful work into these chapters, and it's been woven into a sermon series taking us all the way into September.

For the next two weeks, I'm asking you to carve out time to read the entire letter to the Romans. Perhaps even twice. If reading is not possible, trying listening to it. You will be blessed by the scope of all sixteen chapters.

In this sermon series, we hear God's Greater Story. The story dates from around 55 – 58 AD and comes from the apostle Paul. Paul was in Corinth, about to journey to Jerusalem to bring

an offering from the churches to the poor. As he anticipated that journey, however, he lifted up his eyes and saw something much larger: a missionary trip to Spain. Along the way, he planned to stop by Rome, a place he had never visited. So he sent a letter ahead. To introduce himself as an apostle and to give the Roman church a vision of what he believed.

As you listen to Paul's belief, however, you hear a greater story. Paul is not speaking of a belief that is only for himself, a personal theology or a record of his personal spiritual journey. Paul is speaking of God and God's work among his people, a saving work that includes all nations and that extends throughout all time. Paul's words of faith are not for himself alone but for all peoples. Paul tells the Romans and us God's greater story.

Join us now as we enter into the sermon series, "God's Greater Story." Listen in as Paul offers his theological vision: a vision of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit at work to raise a people for his purpose in the world. Experience God's claim upon your life as he joins you to a people who have a purpose in his plan to renew creation and reclaim all nations for him.

This is God's Greater Story!
