"Take a knee." Coach Patterson of the football Leathernecks WIU would sometimes say that to his team when he introduced me after a practice. They were not kneeling to me, or to their coach. They were getting ready to listen to an invitation to come to the team devotions after the locker room. Not all would accept that invitation, but many did. In chapel they would hear God's Word and we would pray - not for victory, but for faithfulness. They would take a knee before the only Lord worthy of their submission.
