From Our Pastor

In Sunday School this week we are studying Exodus 7, revealing the plagues upon Egypt. Catastrophic events have two spiritual outcomes: they either harden people's hearts and minds against God, or they strip away humanistic hope, prompting a man to repent and trust God. Pharaoh chose the former. He grew more bitter toward the God who loved both him and the Israelites.

What is, or seems, catastrophic in your life this weekend? Will it harden your heart? Will it soften you, stripping away your reliance on self or circumstances so that you trust only God?

"There were some present at that very time who told [Jesus] about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. And he answered them, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered in this way? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish." (Luke 13:1-5)

Today is another day for repentance. Softness of heart acknowledges that God is God. He alone is our hope. Let us think, talk, walk, and worship that way.
