From Our Pastor...

If you're like Kathy and me, you found last week's "Today's Light" daily readings in

Isaiah difficult at a few points, but you kept going. The places and people named in Isaiah 9 and 10 are enough to get you bogged down. Keep



going! Our goal isn't to be able to explain every verse of the Bible, but better to understand the whole scope of the Bible – and we're going to arrive at our goal by God's grace.

One of you wrote to me this week, saying that you are grateful for how relevant Isaiah is to our modern day. The prophet lived in days when the culture around him was rotten. You see that right now, I know. Take heart ... the Lord of the Scriptures is the Lord of these days, and he will never waste a challenge such as this. He will accomplish His purpose (Isaiah 55!).

Here at St. John's we're getting ready to host a couple of events that can greatly impact the future of the church and culture.

On March 6 we will host the Lutheran Laymen's League District Convention from 8:00am-3:00pm. The LLL is also known as "Lutheran Hour Ministries," and the speaker for the day-long Convention will be The International Lutheran Hour Speaker, Rev. Dr. Michael Zeigler. The LLL is excellent at promoting outreach among us. On May 23, Pentecost Sunday, we will host the Effingham-Shelby Circuit Convocation on Ministerial Recruitment from 3:00-6:00pm. Our speaker and preacher will be the former Lutheran Hour Speaker, and President Emeritus of Concordia Seminary, Rev. Dr. Dale Meyer. We'll also have breakout sessions by and former seminary current students, helping us to raise up the next generations of pastors. You'll hear more in coming weeks.

These are tough days for Christians – but haven't they always been? The Word of God, Jesus, is greater than the challenges around us. He is greater than the struggles your household will face this week; plus, He puts Himself in the midst of your household, here at church and there, in your home. Take heart!
