Today's Old Testament reading gives us Jonah's extremely brief sermon, "Yet forty days, and Ninevah shall be overthrown!" Perhaps there was more to it, but that was the core. Law. Law which cuts us down to size – small and without hope in ourselves. But not without hope. "The people of Ninevah believed God." Not in themselves, not in the goodness of Assyria or Ninevah. Not in us, not in the USA or Washington D.C. We believe God. Therefore, we have hope. Abundantly!


