romance, and classroom exchanges when we were kids. That's not bad at all. Yet, the foundation of this Christian holiday –the legend of the life and sacrifice of Valentine – is self-giving love.

Natural marriage is under attack these days. The war is waged by those who pretend that "marriage" is a human institution that we're free to define according to our selfishness. I'm not just referring to folks who believe that two men, or women, can marry one another. The attack also comes through heterosexual women and men damaged by pornography, no-fault divorce, the idolatry of mere happiness, and sex outside of marriage. The sacrifice of Christ is love in action. For you and your neighbors. That's Good News.

Speaking of love, this Lent our midweek worship theme is "Return to the Lord." It's not designed just for those who are living in open sin. It's for all of us.
