Don and Sue are good friends of ours from Greenwich, CT, where Kathy and I lived during my vicarage. Greenwich is a suburb of NYC, and when I was visiting them in 2002 they dropped me off at the train station to go back into the city. As I got out of their car they asked if I wanted them to wait until the train arrived. In the parking lot I loudly answered, "Nope! I've got plenty of money!"

They quickly decided to stay with me. Good Christian friends listen and stay. Sometimes they know what we need even more than we do. And sometimes we are the ones who listen to others and give them what they need, not just what they asked for. For your family and for your friends, give them truth, grace, help, and guidance. Give them Christ. Stay with them. And if you are burdened by the remembrance of times when you haven't — or they haven't — rejoice in Christ's forgiveness.
