From Our Pastor ...

The Resurrection of Our Lord! Alleluia!

"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures..." (1 Cor 15:3-4)

The Apostle Paul didn't have a paper route, but he had a message to deliver. He didn't pedal a bike with a canvas bag over his shoulder, but he had news that people needed to hear. It was a vital message to broadcast: *Jesus died. Jesus rose!* Today we're gathered to receive, believe, and broadcast this good news "of first importance." Nothing else is more important. The bodily resurrection of Jesus, the Christ, changes everything.

Have you heard of La Verne Wimberly of

Tulsa? Her church went to virtual worship in March of 2020, but that didn't stop her from dressing up for Sunday service. For over a year she has continued to put on her finest hats and dresses at the regular



time of her congregation's online worship. She posts a selfie in each set of her Sunday best, for the purpose of encouraging others in her church. I think it also grounds her in the "first importance" of every-Sunday worship and wearing your finest when you come before the resurrected Lord to receive His grace and truth. She says she'll be

back to in-person worship real soon. I hope so. I thank God for her example.

We're dressed up in the righteousness of Jesus when we live in daily repentance. Arrayed in His goodness, we let others know that our lives are lived in the light of His death and resurrection. We deliver the news: Jesus died. Jesus rose! This changes everything.

It's time for church, dear brothers and sisters in Christ! Time to broadcast the fear-silencing announcement of Easter today and every Lord's Day from here on. **Christ is risen. Alleluia!**


