We rarely have original thoughts. We all learn from others, and pass along what we learn. For the past two weeks I've shared portions of an article Pastor Wright shared. Both of us have edited the original to reflect I'm grateful for whomever our contexts. penned the original "Ten Things I Wish People Knew About Ministry." Here are the final three points...

- 8. I wish people would make a decision about a church home and stick with it. These days, many people are content to float in and out of churches like spiritual butterflies, never setting down roots or establishing deep relationships. Churches should not be treated like Aldi and Walmart, where you can hop in and out according to which one has the best deal going this week. If you want to stay, then stay and be a fully functioning member based upon what the congregation teaches and what you believe. If you want to leave, I hope you find a church home that's a good fit. Don't be a Be an oak, rooted in the butterfly. Scriptures.
- 9. I wish you knew how much your encouragement means. I usually do a pretty good job of hiding discouragement. When you send me an encouraging email or note, when you pray for me, when you show love to my family, when you offer to help... that's huge. Many of you are so very good at this. Thank you. Your encouragement for every member of the congregation is appreciated and powerful.
- 10. I wish you knew how much I appreciate you. St. John's has been so supportive over the past two years I have been your pastor. You seem to know how busy I am in a church this size -- teaching, visiting the sick

and elderly (what would we do without Pastor Fortkamp?!), studying for sermons and classes I teach, preparing and leading worship services, and having meetings. You have supported the church so that we have excellent health insurance. Best of all. you come to God's house weekly to receive His Word. You count Christ as your most precious treasure. That thrills me. I know I make mistakes, and need to keep learning. I appreciate you and our We all do. partnership in the Gospel. I truly hope you know that.

Thinking back on all ten wishes, some have been hard to hear and others have been full

The same of joy. could be said if you now composed a list of "ten things I wish pastor knew about our ministry." I welcome that list.



Stewardship Thought
