From our Pastor:

Here's Part 2 of 3, adapting an article that Pastor Wright – and others – shared recently. It was titled **"10 Things I Wish People Knew About Ministry..."**

4. I wish people would stop obsessing over the style of music. Many times, we make this an issue of newer vs. older music, but that argument misses the point. Rather, it is an issue of good vs. poor music. There's older music that is good, and older music that is poor. There is also newer music that is good, and newer music that is poor. The wise worship leader will be able to tell the difference, and the mature church member will be able to participate in a style that is faithful to the church's ministry, despite his or her personal preference.

It is probably helpful for church members to think about what constitutes a good worship song. Here are some criteria I follow:

- It is singable. The average person should be able to learn it after hearing it a few times.
 I admit that some of our hymns are hard to learn.
- It is theologically sound. The song should • reflect good Lutheran biblical theology. Jesus is at the center of the meaning. Works righteousness is nowhere present. It speaks through both the law and the gospel (if you do not know what this is, see me soon.) It tells us we should expect God to communicate with us through Scripture, not through our emotions, intuition, mother nature, or to expect immediate revelations from God apart from the Bible. If it sinas about love, it should be primarily speaking about God's love for sinners, not our love for God, which is at best lukewarm most of the time.
- It is playable. Church musicians should be able to play and lead the song with excellence.
- It is understandable. The message of the song should be clear and unambiguous.

5. I wish you knew how much we need your help. You can pretty much assume that in any given church about 10% of the people do about 90% of the work. It takes a small army of volunteers to make things happen each week. Many people come to church and do not think about how the sound is operated, the communion is prepared, the offering is counted, the video is streamed, the music is selected, or any of a hundred other large and small tasks get done. When you give your time, even just an hour or two a week to help us, it makes a tremendous difference ... and not just for a week or a year-it makes a difference for eternity.

6. I wish you would come to me personally (and privately) when you have a complaint. Don't write an anonymous letter. Don't talk to someone else about the issue. Don't air your grievance on social media. Please, come to me personally if you are unhappy about something I have done (or haven't done). If you do not have the love and courage to speak to someone personally about a complaint, how can a correction be made? In addition, plan to be part of the solution. This is not an attempt to cover over my (our) problems, but if we are not going to follow Jesus' teaching about how to deal with conflict (Matthew 18:15 ff), we are adding to the problem. I try hard not to be a problem, but I know I fail, and I try to be approachable.

7. I wish more people would trust God with their money. Any time I teach about stewardship, it is an uphill battle because many believe "the church only talks about money." It is not all about money, but it is quite high on the priority list of teaching topics. The reason is because money touches every aspect of your life. There is a spiritual component to money that we cannot dismiss. When you trust God with your money and use it according to His principles, strange (and very good!) things happen. (Continued) I wish more people would take that step of faith and experience the blessings God has in store for them. Toward that goal, the Ramsey+ suite of tools we have made available to you are a great blessing.
