The story was very moving. I felt great compassion for the man and his wife. Alzheimer's is a terrible disease. You know. It brings great suffering, and suffering is a terrible burden. But the beauty of the narration didn't equate to the truth of the narrative. We aren't allowed to end our lives. They aren't ours to do with as pleases us, even if the burden is huge.

"For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." Romans 14:7-8

True beauty and joy are found in knowing that we belong to the Lord of Life, and that He will sustain us in the midst of every trial. Every. One. The Lord is with you. He says to you, "You are mine."

- Place the completed form in the offering plate during any worship service between Sept. 25 – Oct. 31

The associate pastor will work alongside Pastor Burdick, working first in all dimensions of our ministry and later specializing in those areas that Pastor Burdick, the Associate Pastor, & congregational leaders believe best match the needs of the congregation and the gifts of the pastor.

It is likely that we will not be calling until early 2023. The Lord will provide. May His will be done!

Stewardship Moment

Amos 6:1a – "Woe to those who are at ease in Zion." The Book of Amos is a warning to God's people who have been given great material wealth. As Jesus Himself mentions, material blessings can turn into temptations – chiefly the temptation to think of ourselves as self-sufficient and independent. What does Amos suggest as a way to combat this temptation? First, faith in the Lord and dependence upon Him! 
Living with Grief Support Group


