We almost always remember thorns instead of roses. If nine people react appropriately to the Law or Gospel, and one spurns them, I often have that rejection stuck in my head for much longer. You, too? Probably.

Last Sunday, members of our congregations joined with many others to form the Life Chain in positive witness to the gift of life and the desire to



rescue children from the evil of abortion. Almost all reactions from drivers were positive. But those fingers and voices that weren't have a special power to stick in our minds like a thorn underfoot that could keep us from moving forward. Remember the roses – the moms, the children, the families, the adoptions, the forgiveness – and keep going.

Keep. Going. Speak the truth in love. Be prepared to speak (or be powerfully silent) when someone's hurt is expressed as hatred.

Above all, speak the Law and Gospel – especially the powerful forgiveness of Christ to those who are hurting. Share the Word of God in your household and neighborhood. It has power that you don't. At our pastors' conference this week I heard an old Luther quote: "God's Word must do the fighting." Go forward, and let it. Remember the roses.

### This Week's Sunday School Lesson

Exodus 14

Today's lesson, "The Egypt Exit," tells of ten terrible plagues and how Pharaoh relents and releases the Israelites to worship in the wilderness. Realizing the Israelites have no intention of returning, Pharaoh's army pursues the runaways. Caught between Pharaoh's charioteers and the waters of the Red Sea, the people cry out to God. Moses stretches his hand over the sea as God parts the waters, enabling the people to pass through the sea on dry ground. As Egypt's army attempts to follow, the sea closes in over them, so not one survives. As a family, talk about the ways God protects us from our enemies today.

roster of the Lutheran Church-  
Missouri Synod.

To submit a name for consideration:

- Take a nomination form from the Welcome  
Center. (Forms available Sept. 25 – Oct. 31)
- Place the completed form in the offering  
plate during any worship service between  
Sept. 25 – Oct. 31

The associate pastor will work alongside Pastor  
Burdick, working first in all dimensions of our  
ministry and later specializing in those areas that  
Pastor Burdick, the Associate Pastor, &  
congregational leaders believe best match the  
needs of the congregation and the gifts of the  
pastor.

It is likely that we will not be calling until early 2023.  
The Lord will provide. May His will be done!
