I have good news for you. Our risen Lord -- ascended to the right hand of the Father -- is near to us through His Word and Sacraments. You knew that already ... but we need to hear it *often*.

I have a little more good news for you – after extensive study, the Elders and I have decided that our congregation will increase the frequency of Holy Communion to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> weekends of the month.

How did we make this decision? The Elders and the Sunday morning Bible class studied the Bible and a booklet titled "A Simple Explanation of Holy Communion." We concluded that the blessing of the Lord's Supper is so real and so good that more frequent reception is right. The small costs, including time and volunteers, are outweighed by the benefits.

Why not the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday weekends? Having a non-communion Service will allow us to use a different liturgy occasionally.

Will we still have Children's Sermons? Yes!

When will this new schedule begin? In September, after we have used the summer to train additional servants for communion ware set-up, cleanup, and distribution. We will create brief videos to begin this training, augmenting the precious work our Altar Guild and Lydia Guild are doing.

Who can help with Communion setup and cleanup? Any members who are able and

willing to be trained. We hope that individuals and families will serve together in his joyous work. Youth can serve with their parents. You can serve!

Will weekly communion lead members to take it for granted and without proper preparation? Only if they choose to. It's possible and it's good to come to the Lord's Table every week in godly repentance and with a holy hunger for God's grace.

Why? Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Those are some of the questions that have already been asked. What are yours? We want to hear from you, and we want to have

our dear church family continue to grow in faith, knowledge, and witness to Jesus. God grant it!
