Our Confirmation students are studying The Lord's Prayer. This week we scratched the surface of *fairness* – how God showers rain and other good things upon even evil people, people who do not repent. It bothers us, doesn't it?

In the minds and hearts of repentant Christians such as you, it also bothers you that you're often not grateful for all good things you receive. And in moments of Biblical clarity and conviction you're struck by an unsettling thought: "I don't deserve anything good." Even our hard work doesn't make us deserving.
