

We are preparing to make a change in January, and with a couple of newsletter notes like this I hope to justify the change and instruct you on Christian stewardship. To receive our weekly offerings in Services, we will switch from passing the offering plates to receiving the offering in the boxes at the doors. This is largely because fewer and fewer people use the offering plates. That's not a problem.

Like many of you, Kathy and I believe that passing the offering plate can be a teaching moment for children to see. However, we also know it's not the only way to teach *joyful*, *firstfruits, sacrificial giving* for the ministry of the Gospel. In fact, <u>talking</u> with children about <u>why</u> and <u>how</u> we decide to give our offering is far more powerful than passing the plate.

So, let's do that. Let us prayerfully decide what percentage of our income will be given back to the Lord. Then, let's give it in the offering boxes at the doors (before or after Service), or give it electronically using our secure portal at <u>www.stjohnsLCMS.net</u>. If we've been given children or grandchildren, let's talk with them about the percentage of our income we give, and how it flows from faith in Jesus, and the responsibility to love our neighbor through the Church.

In worship, we'll still have a brief offering time during which the acolyte will collect attendance/Communion cards, and an usher will carry forward the offerings that have been received in the North door offering box thus far. As always, joyful, firstfruits, sacrificial offerings will be given in worship and online for the ministry of the Gospel.

"Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. As it is written, "He has distributed freely, He has given to the poor; His righteousness endures forever." (2 Cor. 9:7-9)

#### **Cemetery Improvements**
