
THE EAGLE St. John's Weekly Newsletter February 11, 2024

In our Lenten midweek Services we will follow the order of Vespers, beginning on page 229 in the hymnal. While we will omit the Canticle, almost all of the other portions with music will be chanted, with sung responses by the congregation. I believe you'll find it easy and worshipful to sing it. It will all help us explore the theme "Honest Repentance."

On another note, our Tuesday night Catechism Bible Study has enjoyed having twenty participants, some for review, some for membership in our congregation. Thanks be to God!

Finally, February 18 will be the First Sunday in Lent and we'll again begin reviewing the

Catechism in our Services. Each Lord's Day we'll take one small portion on page 321ff of the hymnal for our meditation.

May all of this help you to observe a rich and Christ-centered Lenten season, culminating in the joy of the resurrection, and the children's bright "Alleluias" greeting us March 31. For now, let us remember that we are dust, and to dust we shall return. In Christ,
