There are many titles by which we describe Jesus. Good Shepherd. Lord. King. Here's one we might rarely use: *Priest.* Hebrews 5:6 is speaking of Jesus when it says "You are a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek." A priest intercedes for the people. In the Old Testament he offered sacrifice on behalf of the people and prayed for them. You can see why we refer to Jesus as "priest." He prays for His people (Romans 8:34). He's the final sacrifice.

Over thirty men in our church are working through the book Man Up

! and meet monthly to discuss it. In tonight's meeting we will consider that one of the tasks given to Christian men is to be priests, that is, to be men who intercede for their families and for others. The book challenges men to be disciplined in regular prayer for others: "Prayer is the admission that a man cannot do what needs to be done. It's submission to a higher power, an acknowledgement by the one who is called to be the head of others that he is not his own head.... This is why a man needs to pray." Gentlemen, we must be servant-leaders who pray regularly for others.

Ladies and gentlemen, we all have that privilege and responsibility. We are the "priesthood of all believers" (1 Peter 2:9).

For whom are you praying? What's your routine for prayer? In the name of Jesus, pray with regularity.
