This Sunday evening will be the final "huddle" for the men of St. John's studying the book <u>Man Up!</u>. I'm glad that thirty men have given it their attention and time. The overarching theme of the book is that no man exists for himself. We live for the sake of others. No guy but Jesus does this to perfection. We strive, though, and this book has made some good men better. Here are some of the ideas you find in <u>Man Up!</u> These are good for men and women to consider....

- Growth into "mature manhood" (Eph 4:13) is not growth in independence, prowess, productivity...it is growth as a Christian. (p. 121)
- Nice is not the same as good. Jesus is good, perfectly good, to be sure. But He's not nice
 ... If you cross Him, you won't find Him spineless, ineffective, or agreeable. (129)
- "Man up!" then is first of all an exhortation to consider the work of the perfect Man, the incarnate God, Jesus Christ. Look at Him, the Man up on the cross. (145)
- Fight like Jesus. (269)
- Find mentors. Hear the martyrs. Practice sacrifice. Cultivate satisfaction. Be present. Quit escaping. Keep going. Aim for significance -- not success. Make things. Have a family altar. (chapter 12 subtitles)
