If you're tasked with leading a devotion in a church meeting here at St. John's, please always begin with The Word. In *Portals of Prayer*, don't skip the readings. They are the meat and potatoes. The devotional thoughts from the human author are reflections of the meat and potatoes.

Devotions always begin our staff meetings, then we discuss recent and upcoming ministry activities. This past week, that included gladness that one of our members recently called and asked "what's our church's position on membership in Lodges?" I told the caller how glad I was that they were asking before joining, and were willing to listen to the Word and the church on why we have deep concerns about joining The Masons, The Elks, etc., Our concerns universalist/unchristian focus on the confession of such groups. Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through Me," (John 14:6), but that's not what the tenets of such Lodges say. One thing I failed to say during our staff meeting is that Lodges are not the same as Rotary or Lions Club or Kiwanis, which are civic organizations with no religious tenets. We have no concern about these latter groups.

Above all, we have concern for God's Word and His people. That's why – in our homes and sometimes in our work – we conduct devotions. God speaks, we mimic Him. God bless your devotional life, dear Christians!
