Pastor's Note

Today marks our final Eagle discussion on Stewardship for this month, but we urge you to continue thinking about what it means to steward the gifts God gives you. Stewardship is the way that we manage the gifts that God gives us. It has been at the heart of the Christian life since God created Adam and commanded him to "have dominion over creation." (Gen. 1:28). It is central to our lives as children of God.

One great way to remind yourselves of this fact is to think about the gifts God has given you. To think about the different vocations or roles God has given you. To think about the family and friends God has given you. To think about the material blessings God has given you and the timeliness of those blessings. Think also about the ways in which you can use those gifts to help your neighbors. God certainly blesses each of us and does so differently. This is a blessing as long as we look to Him and His Word to tell us how we should manage them.

In a 2012 article published by the LCMS titled Stewardship: A Theological Perspective, the author writes, "Stewardship is but a synonym for the life of a Christian who is living rightly within all of his relationships: before God as before his fellow creatures. Stewardship is the Christian life and the Christian life is stewardship. "I'll end with this, just as sure as Christian life is stewardship, both can only be done properly when we recognize that everything we have is a gift from God. It makes me think of the hymn, "We give thee but thine own, whate'er the gift may be; all that we have is thine alone, a trust, O Lord, from thee."

A Note on the Reformation

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses on the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. So, 507 years later, why do we still spend so much time discussing the Reformation? We continue to talk about it because it not only sparked the Lutheran movement and the Lutheran Church we are part of today, but also redirected the church back to the significance of God's grace. The primary theological distinction of the Lutheran Reformation was that we are saved by God's grace alone, not by our own works. Numerous princes and representatives of this reformative centered focus on Scripture in the Church became martyrs for the sake of God's grace. We remember those faithful leaders who adhered to the motto of the Reformation and the Lutheran Church: Grace Alone, Faith Alone, and Scripture Alone. May we continue to prioritize what is right and trust in God's grace, not our own works.
