If we say "stewardship" do you think money? Most of us do, but we don't have to. Rather, we can think management of gifts we don't own. It is my hope and prayer that I, as well as my kids and grandkids, my congregation, and my neighbors will not think that we own anything. We're stewards, managers. All things are gifts temporarily placed in our hands.

Marriage is one of those gifts! If we were using the usual Readings in services this weekend -- instead of the LWML Mission readings for "Ready to Serve" – we'd be hearing of the blessing of Adam and Eve and the first marriage. Here's the stewardship blurb associated with that reading:

Mark 10:6 – "But from the beginning of creation ..." In recent years our country, along with most (formerly) Christian nations of Europe, have lost their way when it comes to marriage. We have ignored the fact that it is God who created us. We always go off-the-tracks when we forget that He made us and that everything good in this world comes from His hand. In big things and in small things, in the life of a nation or the life of an individual, things go dreadfully wrong when we ignore the Creator's instructions for life.

Stewardship of marriage begins with acknowledging that it's a gift from God, not a human construct.

Stewardship of *time* is the same. Thank You, Father – grant me wisdom to manage it in godly ways.
