Peace. That's the word of the day. It's almost Christmas. In fact, we're only 3 or 4 days from Christmas. So, what does it mean to have peace in this fallen world? Does it just mean the second Advent candle as we sit here and wait until Christmas to light the Christ candle? Is peace simply that brief satisfaction you get when you give someone the perfect present? Yes, when we give presents at Christmas it often does bring us joy that leads to a moment of peace, but the next day things go back to normal. So, what does peace mean to us in a world that is often so fallen and chaotic? Why does it even matter? Why is it so important that we end each church service with the promise that God gives us His peace? In today's service, we're going to go on a quest for peace.

I want to use this opportunity to share some words from Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German Lutheran pastor who stood against the Nazi Party during WWII and lost his life because of it. This quote comes from a letter Bonhoeffer wrote to his best friend. It was sent on July 21, 1944 — less than a year before he was killed. Here's the quote:

"I'm still discovering right up to this moment, that it is only by living completely in this world that one learns to have faith. One must completely abandon any attempt to make something of oneself... By this worldliness — I mean living unreservedly in life's duties, problems, successes and failures. experiences and perplexities. In so doing we throw ourselves completely into the arms of God, taking seriously, not our own sufferings, but those of God in the watching world with Christ in Gethsemane. That I think is faith; ... and

that is how one becomes a man and a Christian."

Bonhoeffer's point has everything to do with peace. Peace comes by faith and faith comes by waving the white flag of our ambitions. Peace comes from looking to worldly Christ's suffering and resurrection in the midst of our own suffering. True peace comes from knowing and receiving the eternal promise of forgiveness and salvation. I pray that in the chaos of this season, you find a way to cling to the peace that comes only from Jesus!
