Voters Assembly Meeting Tues., Jan. 28 at 7:00pm My new devotional routine in '25 is a one-year reading through the Bible. Like others, the plan I'm using daily assigns an Old Testament, New Testament, and Psalm or Proverb reading. The unexpected blessing of this routine has been seeing connections I had not remembered before. Two examples:

- The day I read the sad narrative of Cain killing Abel, I also read of the birth of Jesus. One reading showed that the first pregnancies in history brought forth death, and the next reading showed that Child Mary carried brought the remedy for all sin and death. It was beautiful to notice the connection.
- On the day I read of the sin in Sodom and Gomorrah, it was followed by reading Jesus' teaching at the end of the Sermon on the Mount: "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like the wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded upon the rock." (Matthew 7:24-25). It's not enough merely to follow a one-year Bible reading plan I am called to put the Word of God into practice. You, too.

Connections. It's not too late to study God's Word and see His marvelous plan to connect heaven and earth, God and man, through the mystery of the cross. His grace is amazing.

"This Week's Sunday School Lesson"

Lesson 2

This week's lesson "Lost-and-Found Wonders." Jesus shares three parables demonstrating our heavenly Father's concern for the lost. The shepherd leaves the ninety-nine sheep to seek one that was lost. A woman sweeps the house to find one of ten silver coins. In the parable of the lost son, a young man squanders his inheritance, ending up in squalor. Determined to plead for his father's mercy and beg to return as a servant, the son instead receives a celebration. Angered at his father's welcome for the prodigal, the older son confronts his father. The father's gentle response reassures the young man of the father's everlasting love and care.
