The Epistle lesson for today comes from 1 Corinthians 13. This chapter is often referred to as the Love chapter of the Bible. When you hear it called that, what do you think of? It sounds warm and cozy doesn't it. But Paul doesn't start it out that way. As you will hear, Paul begins the passage with a couple of conditional sentences. In each of these statements that begin with the word if, Paul expresses that without love, the action is worth nothing. He says that love is the most important part of the way that we use our gifts. This part of 1 Corinthians 13 is anything but warm and cozy.

The type of love that Paul is talking about can be defined as 'the love of a determined will that seeks the true welfare of the other, even when not deserved." The thought of love being a determined will that desires to do good for others makes a lot of sense. This understanding of the love that Paul is talking about reminds us that love is not always easy. Sometimes to love each other means do what needs to be done for the good of those around us even when we don't necessarily want to do it. This came up in our 9 a.m. Bible Study this past Wednesday. Specifically the satisfaction that often comes with doing something that we don't necessarily want to do but we know we need to do.

After all, this is the type of love that Jesus offers us. His love truly is unconditional. When Jesus prayed in Gethsemane "My Father, if it be possible. let this cup pass from nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will." (Jn. 26:39) and then still took our sins to the cross. He displayed the sort of love that Paul is talking. We look to His example, as we take on the tasks that may not want to do. And we remember that "We love because He first loved us." (1 Jn 4:19). As you hear the goodness of God's love today in 1 Corinthians 13, think about ways that you can continue to live a life of love. God's Peace.
