This coming Wednesday, March 5, is Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday, we transition to the season of Lent. It has been a long-standing tradition to give something up for Lent. In doing so, we embark on a 40day journey of fasting. I remember last year... or maybe it was two years ago when I saw a news interview with Mark Wahlberg. He was talking about the fasting (giving things up) that he does during Lent. Yet, the news heading was: Mark Wahlberg's 40-Day Fast. Those words serve as a warning for us. If we fast from something (or give something up for Lent), we need to do it for the right reason — not just to make ourselves healthier or more productive. It's all about Jesus!

When I explained this to our youth group, I said it this way: If you are giving up junk food for Lent, make sure that when you crave it, you remember how much greater Christ's sacrifice was than your sacrifice of no potato chips. After all, Christ took the sins of the whole world on Himself when He died on the cross. If we fail to look to Christ in our Lenten fasting, we miss the point.


There's another way to help us look to Christ's sacrifice during Lent, too. It's to take up a new habit. Just as Jesus took on our sins, we can take on something new that points us to Him. This could be anything, as long as it points us to Jesus. A great example could be reading the Gospel of Mark during Lent or another book. It could be as simple as setting a 1, 2, or 5-minute timer and talking to God for those minutes each day. Christ took on our sins, so we can take something on for these days that brings us closer to Him.

Either way, whether you give something up for Lent or take something on, I encourage you to frame it in a way that points you back to Jesus and His words of hope for you — words that instruct you on how to live and

words that offer forgiveness when you fall short. No matter what, Jesus has spent 40 days in the wilderness before, and He always promises to walk with you as His people... even in these 40 days of Lent.
