As we approach Easter, I want to check in on your Lenten fast. Whether you chose to take up something new or fast from something, it's always good to pause and evaluate how you're doing. Perhaps you've faltered once or twice, or maybe life has gotten so busy that you've forgotten about it entirely. Or, this year, your fasting might be going smoothly. No matter where you stand, you can rest assured that Jesus never faltered or got distracted on His journey to the cross. He walked that road for you, for me, and for all His people.

Even during Lent, it's essential to be reminded that our Lord has His hand in everything. In all that we do, Jesus is at work in each of our lives and through each of us. Sometimes, we become so consumed by our own Lenten fasts—or distracted by the world around us (like the storms and rain we've experienced this week)—that we forget He is right there with us.

It's only when we truly recognize the goodness of Jesus' love for us and allow Him to take His rightful place at the center of our hearts that we can fully embrace the freedom of the Christian life. This freedom comes from understanding our need for God's grace and mercy.

Henri Nouwen, a Dutch theologian put this well when he wrote, "As long as I am constantly concerned about what I 'ought' to say, think, do or feel, I am still the victim of my surroundings and not liberated... But when I can accept my identity from God and allow Him to be the center of my life, I am liberated from compulsion and can move without restraints." What Nouwen is saying is that when we rest in the goodness and mercy of Jesus, everything in our souls falls into place. It is in Jesus' love, that we find ourselves at home.

So, my encouragement for today is this: rest in the goodness and mercy of your Savior this Lent. Whether you've kept up with your fasting or not, remember that the past is in the past. What matters now is the future. Pick your fast back up for this final week of Lent and into Holy Week, if you've set it aside—or keep going strong if you haven't. Either way, trust in God's goodness and mercy for you.

May God continue to bless you.
