Please join us again this year as we unite with numerous organizations in our area and in hundreds of cities around the world for a coordinated pro-life mobilization. Unfortunately, the need for prayer continues to increase, especially in Illinois. Recently, a *3rd trimester abortion clinic* opened in Chicago. It's a second location of the Hope Clinic in Granite City. They will kill babies up to 34 weeks gestation! You can learn more about this terrible development here.

On the positive side — despite passing in the Illinois House, *physician-assisted suicide legislation* was unable to pass in the Illinois Senate during the spring legislative session. This was a tremendous pro-life victory! That said, proponents of the bill will most certainly continue to push for legalization at every opportunity.
