## There's something that the majority of the Church Fathers had in common:

They saw the Book of Psalms as something we should always remain in tune with. The Psalms walk us through the many emotional states we experience throughout our lives. In His divine wisdom, the Lord gave us the Book of Psalms for the days when we don't know what to say or how to say it.

Martin Luther puts it this way:

"When you read in Psalm 1, 'Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked,' you must actually reject the advice that wicked people give you.

When you read, 'But his delight is in the law of the Lord,' you shouldn't take it easy and pat yourself on the back as if you already love the Lord's teachings. For as long as you live, you must think of yourself as someone who desperately needs to love God's teachings even more. When you read, 'Whatever he does prospers," you should wish this for yourself...'

These words from Luther reference Psalm 1, but the concept of living out the Psalms—adapting them in how we act and think—is true for all of them. I encourage you to read the Psalms with this mindset.

This weekend's Psalm of the day offers an excellent opportunity to put this into practice. In Psalm 146, we hear two powerful ideas. First, we are called to avoid placing our trust in earthly rulers. We know that all people sin and fall short of the glory of God—so when we put our trust in human leaders, we set ourselves up for disappointment.

On the other hand, the Psalm tells us that those who hope in the Lord are blessed. We must embrace this call to trust in the Lord above all earthly powers. This is what a majority of Psalm 146 is about!

I pray that you continue to read the Book of Psalms and take action to live in tune with them. May God continue to bless you,

#### Stewardship Moment Amos 6:1a

"Woe to those who are at ease in Zion." The Book of Amos is a warning to God's people who have been given great material wealth. As Jesus Himself mentions, material blessings can turn into temptations — chiefly the temptation to think of ourselves as self-sufficient and independent. What does Amos suggest as a way to combat this temptation? First, faith in the Lord and dependence upon Him! And if our faith is right, we will want to follow the rest of Amos' instructions — to bless the poor with our alms and to make sure the Lord's House is properly cared for. In other words, we are called to align our actions with God's priorities and put others ahead of ourselves.
