Over the past couple of weeks, Pastor Burdick and I have spent a considerable amount of time talking about the routine of family devotions. During last week's Children's Sermon, Pastor Burdick handed out a calendar that offers materials and a schedule for a simple, ageinclusive approach to family devotions. We're committed to continuing our search for new resources to help you build a strong habit of spending time together in God's Word at home.

This was also the focus of our August Parent Gathering. One key topic we explored was how to be creative in teaching biblical principles at home. We reflected on the following quote:

"Kids of any age learn through play, and what better way to help them understand the principles of scripture than through activity?"

Teaching the Faith through activities might feel intimidating at first—and that's okay. But remember, it doesn't need to be elaborate. We shared a few examples, including one where a dad used sticky notes to encourage his children to write down their thoughts on a verse from Proverbs each night. By the end of the month, they had created a commentary on an entire chapter of Proverbs! Another idea was to design a simple game that teaches a virtue or biblical principle. The goal is to make Bible teaching memorable through creativity.

Looking ahead, keep an eye out for more resources to help you put your faith into practice at home and continue pointing to Jesus through your words and actions.
