Our parents didn't use Portals in our home at that point, but each morning that we woke up at Grandma's we witnessed them sipping their coffee, eating hefekranz, and conducting their daily Bible reading and prayers. I was seeing their routine. I didn't appreciate it then, but I cherish the vision now.

You ought to have a routine of Bible reading and prayer, whether you're a house of one or ten persons. Give up on doing it perfectly, but don't give up the routine. Work at it. Be persistent. When you fall down, get back up. Persevere.

Perseverance is at the core of the strange parable Jesus tells us this week in Luke 18:1-8. Her judge was a bad guy, but she persisted in making her request. He gave her what she requested.

Perseverance is to be integrated into your requests (and prayers of praise and thanksgiving) before the Almighty Judge. God is not a bad guy. He's perfectly good, and will give you what is good according to His will. So build a routine. Use our Family Devotional Calendar from the Atrium. When you fall off the routine, get back up.

Your perfect Father in heaven hears and answers. Let us pray!

"This Weeks Sunday School Lesson"

Lesson 8

Today's lesson, "The Egypt Exit," tells of ten terrible plagues and how Pharaoh relents and releases the Israelites to worship in the wilderness. Realizing the Israelites have no intention of returning, Pharaoh's army pursues the runaways. Caught between Pharaoh's charioteers and the waters of the Red Sea, the people cry out to God. Moses stretches his hand over the sea as God parts the waters, enabling the people to pass through the sea on dry ground. As Egypt's army attempts to follow, the sea closes in over them, so not one survives. As a family, talk about the ways God protects us from our enemies today.
