Greetings, Brothers and Sisters! Take a moment to look carefully at the painting on the right. It's a painting of the moment that the angel Gabriel told Mary that she was going to bear a child and that child would be the Messiah, the Son of God, our Savior. Our Advent theme this year is *Mary's Son, Our Savior*. Throughout the next three weeks, we will talk extensively about the way that the Lord used Mary in His perfect plan to save His imperfect people.

The painting to the right is titled The Annunciation. It was painted in 1898 by Henry Ossawa Tanner (1859-1937). It's currently held in the Philadelphia Museum of Art. The painting itself is just under 6ft x 7ft in size, but its meaning is much larger. As you look carefully at the painting, I'm curious what stood out to you. Maybe it was the way that the artist represented Gabriel. He looks like a pillar of light on the left of the painting. Maybe it was the concerned face that Mary is wearing. A face that seems to somehow be frightened yet calm. Both of these things are points of emphasis by the artist, but the thing that stands out the most to me is the sheets and the rug. They are a mess. The rug seems to be bunched up in the middle. When looking at the sheets it does not look like Mary got out of bed slowly. It looks like there was certainly a moment of chaos.

Luke even tells us about the chaos in Luke 1:28-30 where he records,

""Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" ²⁹ But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God."

Let those words ring for you, too. Especially when you find yourselves in the midst of bunched up rugs and the chaos of your life. Because of Mary's Son, Your Savior. You can cling to that message Gabriel delivered from the Father, too. 'Do not be afraid, Child of God, (Because of Jesus) you have found favor with me.'

The Peace of the Lord is with always.

- Joy in being a team player, participating in weekly staff devotions and meetings.

Upcoming Communion Practices

In this new Church Year, we will be introducing a couple of new practices as we distribute the Lord's Supper:

- Beginning December 14, we'll offer glutenfree hosts to those who need them. We'll be learning as we go along, but the plan right now is that the gluten-free hosts will be on the altar on a separate paten (bread tray) from the others, and the pastor will bring the paten to the person who has notified him that they will need one. Normally the person can let the pastor know before Service, but if time doesn't allow for that it's fine for the communicant to say to the pastor while at the rail "gluten free, please" and he'll bring that paten. The person will pick up the gluten-free host directly from the tray. We know of a few people who will prefer this already, and would appreciate it if others would notify the pastors before December 14, if possible.
- In our Christmas Day Service, we'll offer the Communion Chalice to those who prefer it. Since we have only one Chalice, we'll make it available on the lectern (left) side only. A beautiful symbol of the unity we have in Christ, we're making it available due to some inquiries about offering it. The trays of individual communion cups will be offered first. If someone prefers the Chalice, they won't take an individual cup and then pastor on the lectern side will follow with the Chalice. You are encouraged to guide the Chalice to your lips by holding the base of the cup.
