# St. John's Weekly Newsletter December 14, 2025

It was on December 10, 1866, that the constitution of St. John's Lutheran Church was adopted and signed. That means St. John's has been here for 159 years. Pretty incredible, right? But it shouldn't be surprising because it was established on a firm foundation rooted in God's Word.

Many of you reading this probably have a much deeper understanding of the history of St. John's, but even when Word and Sacrament are rightly administered, a congregation may not always grow and thrive. In fact, Satan works hard to make this the case. Even when things are done correctly, he can deceive—just as he did Adam and Eve. Beyond that, other factors can cause a church's physical location to close or move. Sadly, in our synod, as in every denomination, we hear about churches closing for various reasons. It's a reminder to be thankful for what God is doing for us here at St. John's... and what He has been doing for the past 159 years.

So, what does all of this mean for us today? It means we must trust in the Lord today, tomorrow, and in the future. And we must remember that the Church is not just a building but a community of believers. As I pondered what to write for this article, a hymn verse from Built on the Rock (LSB #645) came to mind:

Grant, then, O God, Your will be done, That, when the church bells are ringing, Many in saving faith may come Where Christ His message is bringing: "I know My own; My own know Me. You, not the world, My face shall see. My peace I leave with you. Amen."

Let that continue to be the case here at St. John's for the next 159 years—and many more after that.

#### What to look forward to...

Take note of some special aspects of our calendar in the latter part of this month:

- Children's Christmas Service is December 21 at 10:30am. There will not be adult Bible Class that day. The 10:30am worship will be a non-Communion Service.
- Christmas Eve Communion: 4:00pm, 6:30pm, 9:00pm.
- Christmas Day Communion: 9:00am.
- Our church office will be closed Friday, Dec. 26
- No Service Saturday, December 27.
- Sunday, December 28 there will be ONE Service at 9:00am. The Lord's Supper will be celebrated.

# Which Christmas Service(s) will you attend?

All three Christmas **Eve** Services (4:00, 6:30, and 9:00) are the same, except that the special musical anthem in each is unique. 4:00pm is likely to be crowded. 6:30 & 9:00 will have plenty of room, and plenty of God's Word. In all three Services will be using the offering plates (not the offering boxes at doors) to collect offerings and our attendance/prayer cards. Our Christmas **Day** Service (9:00am) will begin with a procession and culminate with the proclamation, "Joy to the World, the Lord is Come!"

#### **Upcoming Communion Practices**

In this new Church Year, we will be introducing a couple of new practices as we distribute the Lord's Supper:

- Beginning December 14, we'll offer glutenfree hosts to those who need them. We'll be learning as we go along, but the plan right now is that the gluten-free hosts will be on the altar on a separate paten (bread tray) from the others, and the pastor will bring the paten to the person who has notified him that they will need one. Normally the person can let the pastor know before Service, but if time doesn't allow for that it's fine for the communicant to say to the pastor while at the rail "gluten free, please" and he'll bring that paten. The person will pick up the gluten-free host directly from the tray. We know of a few people who will prefer this already, and would appreciate it if others would notify the pastors before service, if possible.
- In our Christmas Day Service, we'll offer the Communion Chalice to those who prefer it. Since we have only one Chalice, we'll make it available on the lectern (left) side only. A beautiful symbol of the unity we have in Christ, we're making it available due to some inquiries about offering it. The trays of individual communion cups will be offered first. If someone prefers the Chalice, they won't take an individual cup and then pastor on the lectern side will follow with the Chalice. You are encouraged to guide the Chalice to your lips by holding the base of the cup.
