St. John's Family,

Year after year, on January 6th, the church celebrates the festival of Epiphany. For Christians today, Epiphany marks the visit by the Wise Men who followed the star to Jesus. It's quite fascinating to many of us today to think that God used a star to guide men to visit the Messiah—but maybe even more fascinating that these people, whom we call the Wise Men, watched the stars so closely and interpreted God's message.

It makes me wonder if there is anything that we watch as closely as the Wise Men did the stars at Jesus' birth. For many of us, I don't think we have to think very hard about what we pay close attention to. We pay extremely close attention to our cell phones. There's been a lot of research about why and how we get so attached to our cell phones, and research indicates that we are not as attached to our cell phones themselves as we are to the information that we receive from our cell phones.

So, the story today isn't that different from that of the Wise Men. We're still paying close attention to the information that is around us. But here's the question: Does the information that you surround yourself with point you to Jesus? It should.

We hear in the first line of the Christmas song, "We three kings of orient are," the word orient comes from the Latin word for east. It's the same root word that we get the word orientation from. It begs the question: What are you oriented to today? Are you, like the Wise Men, oriented to the rising of the Son of God?

Brothers and sisters in Christ, focus on what's important—what your Savior has done for you—and you will be blessed, eternally blessed.

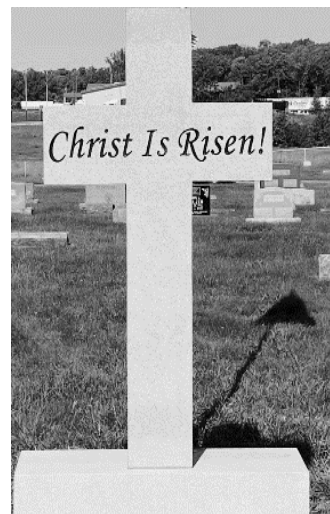
Stewardship Moment

Immanuel-Dutch Lane Cemetery



Our congregation cares for both the St. John's and Immanuel (Dutch Lane) Cemeteries. The Cemetery Committee has commenced a project to add a six-foot granite cross proclaiming "Christ is Risen" to our Immanuel-Dutch Lane Cemetery, identical to the cross and message placed in 2024 at the

St. John's Cemetery! The cost is approximately \$7000. We would like you to know about this opportunity to give a special donation to the memorial fund for the Immanuel Cemetery Cross. Donations should be payable to St. John's and earmarked "Immanuel Cemetery Cross." These gifts will be recorded in the Memorial Book located in the church atrium. Anonymous gifts are welcome, too. Our desire is to glorify God and beautify the Immanuel-Dutch Lane, where the bodies of our Christian loved ones await the promised day of resurrection. Alleluia!

Additionally, the Cemetery Committee asks that visitors to the Dutch Lane cemetery **only exit the Cemetery from the East driveway**, especially if you're turning left to go East on Dutch Lane. The height of the railroad tracks makes the line-of-sight difficult if the car is turning left from the West-end drive.
