The Word of our God will stand forever. Those words have rung through the church for generations, even before the coming of Jesus our Savior. They are words that come from Isaiah's prophecy. In chapter 40, the prophet Isaiah prophesied about the Babylonian Captivity and the deliverance of God's people. In Isaiah's day, the struggle wasn't all that different from the struggles we face and see today. Isaiah lived and prophesied during a time full of the worship of false gods. People turned to false gods and the evil practices that came with worshipping them, leaving their creator and sustainer—the Lord. It is to this setting that Isaiah wrote the words, "**the word of our God will stand forever.**" But we often overlook the overarching passage. Here's more of it:

"The grass withers, the flower fades
when the breath of the Lord blows on it;
surely the people are grass.
The grass withers, the flower fades,
but the word of our God will stand forever."
(Isaiah 40:7-8)

What do these words from Isaiah mean to us about 2,800 years later? They mean the same thing. God is capable of punishing sin, and he does. People fall, but the word of the Lord doesn't. Think about that. This means that the church and its mission are not contingent on individuals. It's not contingent on things that may be here today and gone tomorrow. Its foundation is built on the rock.

Speaking of the rock, St. Peter—whom Jesus named Cephas (which means rock)—quoted Isaiah 40:8 in 1 Peter 1:24-25, where he said:

"All flesh is like grass
and all its glory like the flower of grass.
The grass withers,
and the flower falls,
but the word of the Lord remains forever."

It's not your glory, or accomplishments, or anyone else's that lasts, but it's the glory of the Lord. Glory that came to fulfillment when Jesus died on the cross. And it's glory that isn't just your saving grace, but the saving grace of all who trust in God. So, we move forward and trust in the Lord. Today, we lift our concerns to the Lord, and we know that **His Word will endure forever.** It is more important than ever that we lean on each other and trust in the Lord.


Looking for a New Mission?
