Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today, we celebrate the Transfiguration of Jesus. In the Gospel lesson, we hear about the time when Jesus' inner circle of disciples saw Him in His fully glorified state. Peter, James, and John went with Jesus up on the mountain, and upon seeing Jesus in all His glory with Moses and Elijah, only Peter found words to speak. His offer to put up tents so that everyone present could stay awhile reveals both his excitement and perhaps his nervousness at what he was witnessing. This reminds us that sometimes the best thing we can do is simply listen and observe what God is doing.

Thankfully, Peter was not afraid to continue sharing what he had seen. That's where today's Epistle lesson picks up. In it, Peter reflects on the Transfiguration, writing:

"We were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased,' we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain."

(2 Peter 1:17-18)

This is a message Peter would continue to proclaim as God used him and his platform to help the early church grow. But it was a costly message. It would ultimately cost Peter his life at the hands of the Roman emperor Nero around 65 A.D. History tells us that Peter was crucified upside down for his belief in Jesus. Even today, it might look different but Satan still attacks us because of our faith. At the end of the day, our hope is secure and it's a hope that looks to life everlasting. I pray that in your peaks and valleys, the hope of life everlasting brings you the peace that only Jesus can give.


